A Letter from the Founder and Acting Executive Director

What a Great Year! Living Classroom broke records in its service to the Mountain View Whisman School District by providing 667 experiential hands-on lessons to 3,900 students across 11 schools in grades T/K - 6. We also proudly served 320 students from St. Simon School and Oster School program for deaf and hard of hearing students. Through the capable hands of our experienced instructional team and highly skilled gardeners, our garden-based lessons connected students to nature while teaching important academic content, in our biodiverse native habitat gardens and edible gardens.

Living Classroom also was incredibly proud to unveil the new Muwekma Ohlone Garden at Monta Loma School in late May. This garden features 33 species of locally native plants, all with interpretive signs explaining their use by and importance to the Muwekma Ohlone past and present. A Muwekma Ohlone tribe member was an honored guest and provided a land honoring and blessing for the garden. This is a gem of a garden!



Students explore their school's new Muwekma Ohlone Garden. The garden will be used to teach students how indigenous people used plants in their daily lives and how native plants provide habitat for local animals.

Our impact is immense because not only did 4,220 students receive multiple lessons teaching science and other topics tied to environmental literacy and nutrition education, but they also benefit from up to 8 years of lessons from T/K - 6th grade, with over grade-specific, standard-aligned lessons.

Second graders explore their school's pollinator garden during our Flower Power lesson. The students select and sketch a flower. Then they identify the flowers adaptations and think about which pollinator may visit it. They also get to dissect a flower. By the end of the lesson, the students understand why pollinators are important!



Since our founding in 2008, Living Classroom along with its Los Altos School District-adopted program, have taught over 35,000 students! Our small, but mighty and incredibly resourceful and creative team, has had an outsized impact.


We are grateful for all of our school partners, funders, our incredible staff, volunteer docents, community volunteers, and teachers who year after year, allow us to serve thousands of students each year.


